Cell Aquaculture sends first barramundi harvest

Osborne Park based Cell Aquaculture says it has received positive reviews from the first commercial harvests of barramundi from its production facility in Singapore.

The company said executive chefs in Melbourne and Kuala Lumpur, who had been sent the fish to sample, had responded positively to the quality of the product.


Cell Aquaculture chairman Perry Leach said he believed the company would enjoy significant upside as premium fish prices continued to rise despite falls in other commodity prices.

The company has developed an environmentally responsible land-based aquaculture system for the production of barramundi and other fin fish.

Cell is planning to expand its production facilities in Terengganu in Malaysia to include a multi-species hatchery.

Cell Aquaculture shares closed up 0.2 cents at nine cents.
